Face - Mask - Avatar - Embodiment

A two days conference and Think Tank Meeting co-organized by the Philosophy of Human Technology Research Line of the CFCUL at University of Lisboa (Portugal), the Institute for Critical Theory and the Institute for Performing Arts and Film at the University of the Arts, Zurich in collaboration with EPI-Clinique Lengg, Zurich (Switzerland).

Main Questions:

Would the encounter with your Avatar be about the similarities with you, or the differences, would it seem like an encounter with a ghost, or only an encounter with a mere thing, an uncanny technical object? Avatars, artificial persons, or graphic placeholders of a being become more and more specific, more and more personal and common in today's digital culture. They seem to replace the real body and to make an appearance in a self-chosen form. While the first generation of avatars has been able to act primarily in artificial worlds, the next generation will already interact with the real world, will establish relationships and produce unusual effects. With this, avatars approach what the actors are doing. But are these processes identical? What are the differences? What new perspectives does this development make possible in the context of the self-image and the external image, the recognition of one's own in a stranger? Is there a connection to the figure of the "mask", and can actor knowledge help to describe it? Does our brain deal with the emotional behaviour of avatars as well as that of real people? Does our brain even discern emotional similarities – or does the smile of an avatar simply encounter as a mere grimace? In which sense do we embody our masks, our expressions, or our emotional presence? Is it possible to simulate emotional expressions? What does it mean for us as human beings if we are unable to distinguish between the face of another and the surface of an artificial being? How can the relation between face, faciality, mask and embodiment be described? The German word for face 'Antlitz' includes the gaze of the other that looks back: in which sense do we become a persona within the encounter with the other?
